On January 1, 2021 the balance on our mortgage was \$1,010,711. As of May 23, 2022, the balance was \$454,068. This represents a \$556,643

decrease since January 1, of 2021 as a result of budgeted mortgage payments, additional giving to reduce debt through the year, and gifts made toward campaign commitments. To God be the Glory!

The idea of providing our food pantry kids with school supplies was the brainchild of Janice Liskey in the 1996/1997 school year. She was teaching the middle high Sunday school and wanted to create a mission project that the kids could become active in. At that time, school supplies given out by other organizations were limited to pencils and paper. She started the new idea of giving out just about one of everything that the schools were requesting at the time.

Originally, donations were requested from church members as well as stores. Within a year or two, the idea of having books donated for sale emerged. After Jan gave up teaching the middle schoolers it became a largely Liskey family project made possible by the support of the church member's donations both of books and money. Many times the books returned the following year to be resold and new books bought. At its zenith approximately 75 - 80 were given out each year. Each kit included about \$20.00 worth of supplies.

#### The Mission and Service Commission is grateful to Jan Liskey and her family for the generous commitment of time and energy to both the book sale initiative and providing children with needed school supplies.

The commission is organizing this final book sale and will be donating any remaining books to another organization. If someone in the church feels a call to continue this ministry, please contact the church office by June 7th.
