Life at Massanutten

- Today we continue our exploration of the question: *What does it mean to follow Jesus from the Crossroads?* We invite you to join us each Sunday as we consider this through the lens of Scripture. If you miss a Sunday, you can always catch-up on our website in the worship drop-down menu. Today is the third of a six part series.
- The Massanetta Springs Bible and Church Music Conference begins tonight with worship at 7:00 pm in Hudson Auditorium. Worship is open to the public and takes place at the same time each night in the Auditorium. A special feature this week is the celebration of Massanetta's *Centennial* throughout the day on Wednesday. There will be a number of speakers, events and meals to experience with the Massanetta faith community. The Reverend John Bell of the Iona Community will be leading worship that night. - **Nursery Care** is available today and each Sunday during worship for small children (through age 5). Families are asked to accompany their child to the nursery and pick them up following the service. The nursery is located on the lower level in the preschool wing.

Youth Mission Trip

O.U.R. – Outreach, Understanding, Rejoicing – Hearts is a short-term mission experience for churches and youth groups. Groups are housed in the Craigsville Presbyterian Church, which has full shower facilities.

Throughout the week our youth and adult chaperones:

- Learned about generational poverty and food insecurities
- ◆ Participated in worship, fellowship, and devotion experience during the week as a group and with a local congregation
- Completed service work needed in the community such as preparing lunches for children for 'Read and Feed'
- Spent a full day helping in the food pantry, learning how it supports those who need assistance
- Assisted in the delivery of food to shut-ins

This is the first year Massanutten has sent an overnight group to this mission opportunity serving and learning from the Craigsville Community.
