Life at Massanutten

• As ministries gear up for the new program year, there are opportunities to support and share ourselves. Please take some time to give prayerful consideration to these current volunteer needs:

Youth Group Meals: We need individuals or families to provide meals for our Sunday evening youth gatherings. <u>Contact Julia Sensabaugh</u> for more details.

Nursery: Each Sunday morning during worship, two adults provide hospitality and care to our youngest children. Would you offer yourself one Sunday a month as part of this team of two? <u>Contact Pastor Ann</u> or the church office to let us know!

Transportation: We are aware of church members living at Sunnyside and in other places who wish to attend in-person worship, but are unable due to transportation challenges. Many of these same church members also cannot access worship virtually. To help these members remain engaged in the church, the Community Life Commission, along with church staff, is looking to pilot a transportation program. During this small-scale implementation, we will match volunteer drivers with those needing a ride. **If you are interested in serving as a driver once or more each month**, please contact the church office. Every effort will be made to match the volunteer driver with a church member that lives near them.

• **Open Doors Food Truck Festival** will take place on Saturday, September 17th at the Rockingham County Fair Grounds, 11:00 am—7:00 pm. Volunteers are needed—but so are attendees! For more information, check out the Open Doors website. *Open Doors is a low-barrier shelter for men and women in our area.*



On January 1, 2021 the balance on our mortgage was \$1,071,111. As of August 23, 2022, our loan balance was \$402,621 a decrease of \$668,460 in the last 20 months. Since the beginning of the Debt Reduction Campaign 11 months ago, \$548,114 has been paid on the mortgage.

These decreases are a result of budgeted mortgage payments, additional giving to reduce debt through the year, and gifts made toward campaign commitments. **To God be the Glory!**

COVENANT CLASS (Rm. 117)

PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN & YOUTH BEGIN SEPT. 18TH! CHILDREN (THRU 5TH GRADE) YOUTH (6TH-12TH GRADE)
