- This morning we welcome the Rev. Dr. Teri McDowell Ott to the pulpit. Teri has served in ministry for over twenty-four years in a variety of pastoral roles in the church and as chaplain of Monmouth College in Illinois. She currently serves as the Editor / Publisher of The Presbyterian Outlook, the only independent news resource of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Her first book, Necessary Risks: Challenges Privileged People Need to Face, was inspired by her work with college students and her experience volunteer teaching in a men's prison. Teri is married to the Rev. Dr. Daniel J. Ott who serves Eastern Mennonite University as Dean of Theology, Humanities and Performing Arts. They have two teenagers, Isaac and Ella, who attend Eastern Mennonite School.
