Our 2023 Lenten theme is Seeking: Honest Questions for Deeper Faith. Our friends at Sanctified Art developed this theme to follow the lectionary scriptures for 2023, which highlight people who are seeking depth or transformation in their lives. We are the beneficiaries of these encounters in scripture, as they help us to exercise the spiritual practice of seeking ourselves – lifting up deep questions that strengthen our faith. This Lenten theme will carry through our worship liturgy, sermons, and the Lenten study group.

We are getting very close to the point of joining in the hands-on work of this effort and today we are invited to celebrate our families by writing encouraging notes on the framing boards of their home in advance of drywalling.
- FLOCKS OF CHICKS mission project Massanutten Presbyterian Women invite the congregation to join in this Heifer International initiative. We're challenging the congregation to join us in purchasing flocks of baby chicks to be given to families in need, along with education on their care. They raise the chicks into hens and use their eggs for nourishment, for income when sold and for sharing with others by passing on the gift.
