On January 1, 2021, the balance on our mortgage was \$1,071,111. As of April 21, 2023, our balance was \$193,576 a decrease of **\$877,535** since January 2021.

Since the Debt Elimination Campaign began in September 2021, \$757,189 has been paid on the mortgage as a result of budgeted mortgage payments, additional giving to reduce debt through the year, & gifts made toward campaign commitments. **To God be the Glory!**
