On January 1, 2021, the balance on our mortgage was \$1,071,111. As of June 22, 2023, our balance was \$157,659 a decrease of **\$913,452** since January 2021.

Since the Debt Elimination Campaign began in September 2021, \$793,106 has been paid on the mortgage as a result of budgeted mortgage payments, additional giving to reduce debt through the year and gifts made toward campaign commitments. **To God be the Glory!**
