On January 1, 2021, the balance on our mortgage was \$1,071,111. As of July 21, 2023, our balance was \$147,747 a decrease of **\$923,364** since January 2021. Since the Debt Elimination Campaign began in September 2021, \$803,018 has been paid on the mortgage as a result of budgeted mort-gage payments, additional giving to reduce debt through the year and gifts made toward campaign commitments. **To God be the Glory!**
