On January 1, 2021, the balance on our mortgage was \$1,071,111. As of August 22, 2023, our balance was \$131,776 - a decrease of \$939,335.

Since the Debt Elimination Campaign began on September 1, 2021, \$818,989 has been paid on the mortgage as a result of budgeted mortgage payments, additional giving to reduce debt through the year and gifts made toward campaign commitments.
