**Our Building & Property:  
*Serving Our Community***

*Our building is more than just brick and mortar. It is a shared space where we join together to serve one another and our neighbors. Thanks to the faithfulness of MPC members past and present, we are able to share God's gifts through the use of our building and property. On top of the many ways our congregation uses our facility for ministry, here are just some of ways we help our community through the use of our building.*



Our church supports Boy Scouts Troop 28 and Cub Scouts Pack 120. Scouts meet monthly in the Fellowship Hall with around 60 in attendance. There are Den meetings held twice a week in two downstairs rooms. Since 1994, there have been 72 Eagle Scouts to emerge from Troop 28 - including names such as Enslin, Dobroth, Lown, and Sensabaugh.

VOICE is a volunteer community musical organization which performs concerts to benefit local charities. Last April, VOICE held a fundraiser in the Fellowship Hall, raising more than \$2,000 to cover concert expenses. That allowed one hundred percent of the ticket sales for their concerts in June to go to local charities.



Valley Program for Aging Services (VPAS) conducted a "Virtual Dementia Tour" (VDT) last October at MPC. This program, which used multiple rooms on the ground level, provides education regarding dementia, allowing caregivers to better empathize with what their loved ones are experiencing.



Founded in 2010 by the nationally-recognized composer and director Kath Wissinger, this community handbell group practices regularly at MPC. There is a concert scheduled for late April in our sanctuary.

Through the years our building has also been a place for a hot meal and a place to sleep (Open Doors), a place to celebrate music (Massanutten Brass Band, Valley Treble Voices, and more), a place to meet and address community needs (Valley Interfaith Action), and a place to exercise your civic duty to vote (polling location for 5+ years).



The chief way we share our building with the community is through the Massanutten Presbyterian Preschool. The Preschool roots go back to 1984 with Sally Brown as director & teacher. Through the years the Preschool has evolved into a program with a wonderful, dedicated staff, and with classrooms specially designed to support and foster the learning of the children of our community.

The school currently has three classrooms with two 3-year-old classes (M/T and W/TH) and two 4-year-old classrooms (M/T/W and M/T/W/TH). The classes include various religious components such as songs, stories, monthly bible verses, and a daily pre-snack prayer. Our playground, Fellowship Hall, and sanctuary all play an integral part in the preschool activities. Since 2005 when additional classrooms were built, about 45 students per school year have attended the MPC preschool.
